#### Welcome

Raul Munoz of the Pima County Health Department (PCHD) welcomed everyone in attendance and a round-robin of introductions was done. The group was provided a copy of the agenda, the action plan for the Community Awareness Task Force, and a summary of the action plan for the entire Substance Misuse & Mental Health Alliance.

### **Train-the-Trainer Presentation in August**

Raul offered a brief overview of the RX 360 training that was provided at the August Community Awareness meeting and passed out training certificates to those in attendance. Raul noted that the Prescription Drug Overdose Program can offer additional trainings for those who were unable to attend the August training.

Raul noted that specific correspondence content is being drafted to help connect group members / presenters with each school's "point of contact." This correspondence will be sent out on behalf of Healthy Pima to help bridge the gap and ensure that the presentation is tailored to meet the needs of the school. The group noted that Marana High School and Flowing Wells High School were not included and can be added to the contact list.

# **Deterra Bags**

Raul shared that PCHD received 1,000 Deterra Bags from ADHS this month and that PCHD provided bags to all 26 Pima County Libraries. Each library posted flyers to inform the public about the bags and library staff were trained on how the bags work. Raul also noted that there are preliminary talks about providing Naloxone at hospitals. Additionally, the group discussed providing Deterra bags to hospice care. Raul suggested looking at larger versions of the Deterra bags, including the drum size for large volumes of pills.

The group discussed providing Deterra bags to other distributors including PCAO and the Lutheran Social Services Meals on Wheel program. Raul stated that all he needed was an email address of the distributor and the number of bags that they require, however, the bags are only available while supplies last. Additionally, bags are available to the public upon request.

### **Infographic Update**

Raul shared the new Dispose-A-Med infographic sheet that includes at home safe disposal methods for sharps and liquids as well as the addresses of all drop box locations. The infographic also includes information about the disposal of sharps and noted that the Southern Arizona AIDS Foundations (SAAF) and some clinics have them available. Sharps should also be placed in a sealed, impenetrable container for disposal while liquids should be disposed of using coffee grounds should be mixed with cat litter or coffee grounds before being placed in a sealed container.

Charlotte Smith and Rachel Cummings, AmeriCorps VISTA members at the Pima County Health Department, are in the process of dropping off Dispose-A-Med cards to all the drop box locations that include the website for the Dispose-A-Med program. Charlotte noted that sometimes pharmacists are unsure how to properly disposal of sharps and that the infographic sheet includes this information. The group recommended that the infographic include the date that the sheet was updated to ensure that the information accurately reflects the most up-to-date drop box locations, including rural sites.

Raul noted that there are new infographics under development that address youth substance misuse, neonatal abstinence syndrome, and older adult misuse as well as an updated Dispose-A-Med sheet. Noel Valle, Pima County Health Department, will be meeting with Pima County's Communications department to make suggested changes to the infographic sheets on September 20<sup>th</sup>. The group discussed providing the infographic at events including the Aging Summit.

#### **ADHS Action Plan**

The group reviewed the action plan for the Healthy Pima Substance Misuse and Opioid Alliance and Raul offered a brief overview of the <u>ADHS Opioid Action Plan</u>. The ADHS Plan provides statistics related to opioid use in Arizona and Raul noted how the Alliance's work aligns with the state's plan. The group is encouraged to review the ADHS plan and identify items that they would like incorporated into the Community Awareness action plan moving forward.
